Record of Proceedings Coshocton City Council Meeting Held: November 26, 2018

The regular session of the Coshocton City Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by Council President Pro Tem Jackie Salmans. Council Members present were Mr. Brad Fuller, Mr. Tom Grier, Mr. Mike Gross, Mr. Chad Johnson, Mr. Roger Moore, Mr. Glenn Mishler, and Cherry Wilson, Clerk. Tom Grier made a motion to excuse President Cliff Biggers, seconded by Roger Moore, all members voted yes. Also, present Mr. Steve Mercer, Mayor and Mr. Max Crown, Safety Service Director.

Previous Meeting Minutes: President Pro Tem Salmans confirmed that all council members had received the minutes from 11/13/18. Tom Grier made the motion to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by Chad Johnson. After a roll call vote all members voted yes.

Petitions & Remonstrance's: Several residents from Vine Street expressed concern regarding a neighbor on South Lawn Avenue. His property is unkept, is unsightly and harbors rodents and insects which then travel to the neighbors. They also question their safety as well as their health with him in the neighborhood. City administration is familiar with this resident and are in the process of legal action against his unkept property. The deputy present encouraged the neighbors to call in his behaviors, even if we can't press charges at that time, we can build a pattern. Everyone expressed their sympathies for the neighbors.

City Officers Reports:

Mayor's Report: The Mayor was present with no report.

<u>Service Director's Report:</u> Max Crown reported the city is working on picking up leaves and patching water holes.

Sheriff's Report: A Deputy was present with no report.

<u>Auditor's Report:</u> Auditor Sherry Kirkpatrick was present and asked for the Detailed Check Report dated 11/16/18 be approved. Glenn Mishler made a motion to approve as submitted, seconded by Brad Fuller, all voted yes.

<u>Property Code Investigator's Report</u>: Jeff Corder was present, he reported he has sent the Law Director two vacant commercial properties that have not complied with the ordinance that is now in effect.

55-18 18 transfers. After the first reading Glenn Mishler made a motion to suspend the rules and give ordinance a second reading, seconded by Tom Grier, all members voted yes. After the second reading Chad Johnson made a motion to suspend the rules and give ordinance a third reading, seconded by Tom Grier, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 55-18 passed with emergency clause.

56-18 appropriations. After the first reading Tom Grier made a motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a second reading, seconded by Roger Moore, all members voted yes. After the second reading Brad Fuller made a motion to suspend the rules and give ordinance a third reading, seconded by Chad Johnson, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 56-18 passed with emergency clause.

57-18 an ordinance establishing wages for those positions that are exempt from collective bargaining. After the first reading Roger Moore made a motion to suspend the rules and give

the ordinance a second reading, seconded by Mike Gross, all members voted yes. After the second reading ordinance is to take its course.

58-18 an ordinance establishing the Property Code Investigator as a fulltime position with the City of Coshocton. After the first reading Chad Johnson made a motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a second reading, seconded by Glenn Mishler, all members voted yes. After the second reading ordinance is to take its course.

Legislation at second reading:

52-18 an ordinance to appropriate funds for current expenses and other expenditures for the City of Coshocton, State of Ohio, for January 1, 2019, through December 31, 2019. Roger Moore made a motion to accept the amended attachment Auditor Sherry Kirkpatrick submitted, seconded by Brad Fuller, 6 members voted yes, with Tom Grier voting no. Ordinance to take its course.
