

**Record of Proceedings
Coshocton City Council
Meeting Held: July 23, 2018**

The regular session of the Coshocton City Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by Council President Cliff Biggers. Council Members present were President Cliff Biggers, Mr. Mike Gross, Mr. Chad Johnson, Ms. Jackie Salmans, Mr. Roger Moore, Mr. Tom Grier, Mr. Glenn Mishler and Cherry Wilson, Clerk. Also, present Mr. Steve Mercer, Mayor and Mr. Max Crown, Safety Service Director. Jackie Salmans made a motion to excuse Mr. Brad Fuller, seconded by Chad Johnson, all members voted yes to excuse Mr. Fuller.

Previous Meeting Minutes: President Biggers confirmed that all council members had received the minutes from 7/9/18 and Special Meeting 7/16/18. Tom Grier made the motion to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by Glenn Mishler. After a roll call vote all members voted yes, with Roger Moore abstaining.

Petitions & Remonstrance's: Pastor Mike Jansen complimented council on the top-notch job being done on the bridge project. He thanked council for all the work they do for the community and told them it was much appreciated.

Karen O'Dell of Denman Av asked council to object to the change of the injection well application from Buckeye Brine. Her concerns are Coshocton's water being contaminated if there was ever a breach in the wells.

Reports of Standing or Special Committees: None.

City Officers Reports:

Mayor's Report: The Mayor announced he is seeking a council member to sit on a health board consolidation feasibility study. If anyone is willing to serve he asked them to let him know. The Mayor also announced the America in Bloom Judges are in town and he met with them this morning. They will be giving their comments tomorrow at Clary Gardens.

Service Director's Report: Max Crown reported Sunday will be his church's Community Impact Day and they will be working in the new Waterworks Park area. The church also gave the city a sizeable donation today to go toward the park. He is also working with FEMA seeking a grant to fund repairing a storm sewer that got washed out of the ground in Roscoe Village.

Law Director's Report: Bob Skelton was present; his monthly report was in council packets.

Auditor's Report: Sherry Kirkpatrick was present with no report.

Property Code Investigator's Report: Jeff Corder was present and reported the property discussed at a previous meeting in Roscoe had been mowed and the neighbors were happy with the resolution.

Sheriff's Office Report: An Officer was present with no report.

Introduction of Ordinances:

Additions: Chad Johnson made a motion to add Resolution 7-18 to the Agenda, seconded by Roger Moore, all members voted yes.

Legislation at first reading:

33-18 appropriations. After the first reading Tom Grier made a motion to suspend the rules and give ordinance a second reading, seconded by Roger Moore, all members voted yes. After the second reading Chad Johnson made a motion to suspend the rules and give ordinance a third reading, seconded by Mike Gross, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 33-18 passed with emergency clause.

Legislation at second reading:

23-18 an ordinance authorizing the mayor or service director to sign all documents necessary for the city to purchase property at 1100 Walnut Street in the City of Coshocton. After the second reading Tom Grier made a motion to give the ordinance a third reading, seconded by Glenn Mishler, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 23-18 passed.

Legislation at third reading:

20-18 an ordinance to amend Chapter 1327 signs section 1327.03 prohibitions of the City of Coshocton's, Codified Ordinances. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 20-18 passed.

Resolutions:

7-18 a resolution requesting certification of Millage for Tax Levy in the City of Coshocton in the State of Ohio. All members voted yes. Resolution 17 – 18 was adopted.


New Business: None


Communications:

The clerk read correspondence from Coshocton County Clerk of Courts that offered the city property at 318 South Sixth Street. Council was not interested.

Adjournment:

Jackie Salmans made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Chad Johnson, all members voted yes. Council adjourned at 7:23 PM.
